
Spotlight on Learning

This week we would like to tell you about learning in Maths.

Across the country, Maths is a subject with a focus on basic skills as these skills are needed for lifelong learning. Mr London, as Subject Leader for Maths, has reviewed and assessed how we teach Maths at St Joseph's. Through this process, we decided as a school, to move to teaching Maths through White Rose Maths and NCTEM. This is so that the children are taught Maths at Mastery level.

Mr London has delivered CPD for teachers on this throughout the term as well as working with other local schools to ensure we have good practice in the teaching and learning of Maths. He has also attended some training from a range of different providers to ensure that we are always up to date with what research shows.

This term, the children across the school have been learning about the place value of numbers e.g how many hundreds, tens, ones (Note here how the word units has been replaced with the word 'ones'). After this, the children moved on to adding and subtracting numbers – see below for how this is represented.





After learning about addition and subtraction, the other units of learning vary from year group to year group. Year six, for example. have a heavy focus on key arithmetical skills such as long multiplication and long division. Below is a snap shot of learning from Year 6 at working towards, at age related expectations and greater depth.





Huge congratulations to Year Six who have set a new school weekly record on Mathletics of 143,200 points. This beats the previous record that the class set last year of 134,000. What a brilliant team effort!
