St Joseph's Pre-School

We are proud of our Pre-School, which sets the foundations for learning in our school community. The children enjoy learning through interactive experiences and are guided by skilled adults. The children join in key stage activities, such as weekly assemblies and early years themed events.



St Joseph's is a Catholic school with a true Christian ethos. We welcome applications from children of different faiths and no faith.

By attending St Joseph's Pre-School, children have continuity in their educational experience and establish good friendships with their peers.



St Joseph's Pre-School, Reception Class and Year 1 Class all follow the learning style as recommended by Early Excellence.

Our Pre-School runs from 8:45am – 3:15pm term times. Pre-School children can also access Breakfast Club from 7:15am and After School Club from 3:20pm.







Enrichment – Trips and Residential Experiences

Each term, the children have a trip or workshop to complement their learning in school. Year 2 went on the public bus to Danbury Park to extend their science learning. We also provide additional opportunities for enrichment – our choir took part in the Barnardo's 'Imagine' concert at the Royal Albert Hall! Places that the children have been to on trips to are:

The Science Museum, The Tower of London, Stow Maries Aerodrome, Hampton Court









Year 5 attend Bradwell Outdoor Centre for a 3 day/2 night residential.

Year 6 go to the Isle of wight for bespoke activities for 5 days/4 nights.

Both Year 5 and Year 6 have the opportunity to go skiing in Italy.

Broad and Balanced Curriculum

Our latest OFSTED report described our curriculum as, 'carefully constructed to ensure that pupils are able to build on key parts of knowledge as they progress.' We ensure that all children have a broad and balanced curriculum that provides opportunities to deepen and expand their knowledge in all subject areas.





We aim to develop children who have the academic and social skills needed for life. We do this through nurturing both their intellectual growth and their social-emotional well-being. Therefore, our curriculum fosters critical thinking, emotional intelligence, creativity, and collaboration alongside academic achievement.















Catholic Life and Mission

We are a voluntary aided Catholic primary school. As such our faith is central to our school ethos and philosophy. We interweave our faith through the Gospel values which align with British values. Our mission is to inspire and guide children to emulate St. Joseph's example of humility, faith, and service which is a powerful foundation for young hearts. St. Joseph's silent strength and dedication to others make him a perfect role model for nurturing these qualities. Children are taught RE through the 'To Know You More Clearly' curriculum provided by Brentwood Diocese.





All our assemblies are based around our religion – they will relate to the readings in Church at the weekend, be song based – Hymn Practice, be child led worship or be linked to specific stories in the Bible or events in the news. Our Faith Leaders, hold a Bible Club session weekly which the children can choose to attend and which they really enjoy!

Music & PE

Through our curriculum, we ensure that children have the opportunity to explore music and physical education (PE) in greater depth.

We are fortunate to have a specialist music teacher who works with all year groups, a dedicated guitar teacher, and, starting in January 2025, a piano teacher. Additionally, our students participate in both the Infant and Junior Music Festivals, providing them with valuable performance experiences. Parents enjoy the RockSteady performances that the children and their teacher put on termly.

We have created a fantastic environment for physical education! Having three different PE specialists really enriches the quality and variety of the lessons. The opportunity to apply learned skills through weekly competitions and various sports events keeps the students engaged, develop teamwork, and foster a love for physical activity.











Admission Arrangements



St Joseph's Catholic Primary School and Pre-School provides a Catholic education for pupils aged 3 to 11 years. Everyone is welcome, you do not have to be Catholic to attend our school, however, our admissions criteria gives preference (amongst other criteria) to children who are Catholics.

School Information

School Hours

8:40am – school opens, parents accompany children in Pre-School, Reception and Year 1 to their classrooms. Children in Years 2 – 6, walk into school themselves. School starts at 8:50am.

12:00pm – 1:00pm – lunchtime for children in Reception to Year 6. (Pre-School children have lunch 11:45am – 1:15pm).

3:20pm – the school day finishes.

EYFS and KS1children have a morning break 10:10am – 10:25am KS2 children have a morning break 10:30am – 10:45am.

Breakfast Club

St Joseph's Breakfast Club runs from 7:15am to 8:50am each morning for children in Pre-School – Year 6. School staff who know the children run Breakfast Club. Children have a range of foods to choose from for their breakfast and they have the opportunity to make friends with children of all ages in a safe, secure and relaxed environment. All children are taken to their classes ready for learning.

School Meals

St Joseph's has a healthy school award, this means that the food the children have throughout the day needs to be of good nutritional value. School meals are prepared on site and managed by Dolce. There is a range of four different meals daily which the children can choose from, including vegetarian options.

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 automatically have their cooked dinners provided free of charge through the Government's Universal Free School Meals offer.

If your child would prefer a packed lunch, they can choose this option in any year group. We ask that children do not bring in any items that contain nuts, and that there is no sweets, chocolate or glass bottles/cans of fizzy drinks. As a healthy school, we promote packed lunches that contain proteins, carbohydrates, vegetables, fruits and dairy products.

Break Times

At morning break time, children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 have access to pieces of fruit, free of charge. All children may bring in their own fruit or healthy snack.



School Information

After School Club

After School Club runs from 3:20pm – 6:00pm for children in Pre-School to Year 6. The children play together, access a range of resources for fun and make new friends in our nurturing provision. All children attending the After School Club, are provided with a light snack of wraps, toast, fruit, and yoghurt.

Forest School

We have the Branch Out company provide Forest School sessions for all children from Pre-School to Year 6. On Tuesday afternoons, the children get to explore, learn, make and create within the sessions. Children wear non-school uniform when attending Forest School, as they enjoy the sessions in all weathers!



Children in Years 2-6 go swimming for a term at the local leisure centre which is just a 5 minute walk from St Joseph's.
